ENVIRONMENTAL CLEARANCE OF STATE FUNDED EXEMPTED PROJECTS

Under Indiana code IC 13-12-4-5, the Indiana Department of Transportation has determined certain types of projects to be exempt from the State Environmental Policy Act requirements outlined in 327 IAC 11. As this project has been determined to be excluded from the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) requirements outlined in 40 CFR 1502.22 (b) it meets the requirements of the State Environmental Policy Act. As long as funding, approval, and permitting requirements remain the same as reported on this form, at letting this project is exempted under 327 IAC 11-1-3, sec. 3. (e) (1). The following table demonstrates the exemptions agreed upon by the Indiana Department of Environmental Management and the Governor of the State of Indiana in accordance with 327 IAC 11, and under the authority of IC 13-12-4 and 13-14-8.

SCOPE OF WORK

INDOT and IDOA recognize that state-owned excess right-of-way exists at various locations throughout the state. This land provides no function to the state highway system in terms of serviceability or maintenance, and prohibits development of the property for productive use for residential, commercial, agricultural, or other private or public use.

Additionally, state-ownership of land may reduce the availability of real estate that is subject to property taxation; revenue which could benefit the community as a whole. Selling such excess parcels of land would benefit the above causes, as well as providing the potential for additional revenue to the state from the proceeds of the sale.

Parcel 223, divided into two (2) portions by US 31, includes one (1) portion located in the southwest quadrant of the US 31 and Kern Road intersection, and another portion located approximately 0.25 mile south-southwest of the US 31 and Kern Road intersection. The parcels total approximately 5.632 acres combined.

Statements of Disclosure:

Lakes: One (1) unmapped lake is located within the northern portions of both subject parcels. No impact is expected; however, potential buyers should be informed.

The subject parcels are located within the South Bend (St. Joseph County) UAB. No impact is expected; however, potential buyers should be informed.

With regard to above-ground resources, this parcel was included in the studies for INDOT Des. No. 9405230, the US 31 Plymouth to South Bend project. As can be seen from the attached excerpted historic properties report (HPR) pages and the project's area of potential effects (APE) map, the identification efforts for the project did not identify any National Register eligible or listed properties on or adjacent to this parcel. The nearest National Register eligible property is the Ullery/Farneman House, IHSSI #141-339-70018. It is located approximately 0.18 mile northeast the parcel. As can be seen on the attached mapping with aerial photography from 2016, aside from the above-mentioned property, several "contributing" IHSSI properties are located along Old US 31 to the east of the parcel.



Parcel 223 is a wooded lot. The only items that might be present on this parcel are utility poles and lines, and wire fences. We do not think that this parcel contains any historic sites or structures or that its sale will impact any historic properties. No further aboveground work is recommended prior to the sale of the parcel.

INDOT-CRO personnel who meet the Secretary of Interior's Professional Qualification Standards as per 36 CFR Part 61 completed a Phase Ia archaeological investigation of this parcel (Coon, December 17, 2021). Site 12-Sj-599 was newly recorded as a result of the investigation. This site consists of a low density unidentified prehistoric lithic scatter and a 19th century historical artifact scatter. This site is recommended to be ineligible for the NRHP and it is recommended that the sale of this parcel be allowed to proceed as planned.

SHPO concurred on March 17, 2022.

Dear Dr. Coon:

Pursuant to Indiana Code 14-21-1-14, the Indiana Department of Natural Resources, Division of Historic Preservation and Archaeology ("DNR-DHPA") has reviewed your review request submittal form, with enclosures, dated and received February 15, 2022, for the above indicated project in Centre Township, St. Joseph County, Indiana.

Based on the information you provided, it does not appear that Excess Parcel No. 223 (LA Code 5272), located on the east side of US 31 south of Kern Road, contains a structure that could be eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places ("NRHP") or the Indiana Register of Historic Sites and Structures ("IRHSS").

Additionally, based on the documentation available to Indiana DNR-DHPA, we have not identified any currently known archaeological resources listed or eligible for inclusion in the NRHP or IRHSS within Excess Parcel No. 223 (LA Code 5272). We concur with the opinion of the archaeologist, as expressed in the archaeological records check and Phase Ia field reconnaissance survey report (Coon, 02/07/2022), that archaeological site 12-Sj-0599—which was identified during the archaeological investigations—does not appear to be eligible for inclusion in the NRHP, and that no further archaeological investigations appear necessary at Excess Parcel No. 223 (LA Code 5272).

Accordingly, we do not believe that Excess Parcel No. 223 (LA Code 5272), in Centre Township, St. Joseph County, contains a historic site or historic structure.

If any archaeological artifacts, features, or human remains are uncovered during construction, state law (Indiana Code 14-21-1-27 & 29) requires that the discovery must be reported to Indiana DNR-DHPA within two (2) business days. In that event, please call (317) 232-1646.

Additionally, we note that the archaeological site survey record form associated with these archaeological investigations (i.e., the form for archaeological site 12-Sj-0599) was submitted to the Indiana DNR-DHPA SHAARD system database. This form has been reviewed and approved.

The Indiana Department of Transportation, Cultural Resources Office has evaluated LA Code 5272 Parcel 223 that was acquired in association with US 31 improvements in St. Joseph County (Des. No. 9405230, 9904300 & 9904310). INDOT has determined that this parcel is excess and, pending DHPA review, intends to offer it for sale.

With regard to above-ground resources, this parcel was included in the studies for INDOT Des. No. 9405230, the US 31 Plymouth to South Bend project. As can be seen from the attached excerpted historic properties report (HPR) pages and the project's area of potential effects (APE) map, the identification efforts for the project did not identify any National Register eligible or listed properties on or adjacent to this parcel. The nearest National Register eligible property is the Ullery/Farneman House, IHSSI #141-339-70018. It is located approximately 0.18 mile northeast the parcel. As can be seen on the attached mapping with aerial photography from 2016, aside from the above-mentioned property, several "contributing" IHSSI properties are located along Old US 31 to the east of the parcel.

Parcel 223 is a wooded lot. The only items that might be present on this parcel are utility poles and lines, and wire fences. We do not think that this parcel contains any historic sites or structures or that its sale will impact any historic properties. No further above-ground work is recommended prior to the sale of the parcel.



EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Historic Property Report documents the methodology and determinations of eligibility of historic properties for listing in the National Register of Historic Places as part of the Section 106 process for the U.S. 31 Plymouth to South Bend Study. Historic properties were identified and evaluated in accordance with Section 106, National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) of 1966, as amended, and CFR Part 800 (Revised January 2001) and Final Rule on Revision of Current Regulations dated 12 December 2000.

Project historians for the Indiana Department of Transportation identified and evaluated historic properties in consultation with the Indiana State Historic Preservation Officer, the Federal Highway Administration, and the consulting parties to this project.

There are two National Register listed properties in the Area of Potential Effects:



MANAGEMENT SUMMARY

INDOT proposes the sale of excess parcel 5272-223, which was acquired in association with US 31 construction (Des. No. 9904300 and 9904310). INDOT has determined that this surplus land will not be needed for right-of-way or other transportation purposes within a reasonable time in the future.

The proposed sale of this excess land is not a federal undertaking, and therefore Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act does not apply. However, archaeological investigation is required under IC 14-21-1-14, which outlines duties upon proposed transfers of property by the State. Under this statute, properties must be inspected for the presence of significant historic sites or structures before they are transferred out of State ownership.

A Phase Ia field reconnaissance survey of the parcel was conducted in November of 2017 and September of 2019. The survey was conducted to identify any archaeological resources present within the project area and to assess their significance in terms of meeting the criteria for listing in the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP). The Phase Ia field investigations were performed in accordance with the 2019 "Guidebook for Indiana Historic Sites and Structures Inventory – Archaeological Sites" issued by the Division of Historic Preservation and Archaeology and with INDOT's Cultural Resources Manual. All aspects of the Phase Ia investigations and the subsequent report preparation were conducted by a qualified professional archaeologist meeting the standards set forth by the U.S. Department of the Interior outlined in 36 CFR Part 61 and 66, and the Secretary of the Interior's "Guidelines for Historic Preservation and Archaeology" (48 FR 44716) and 312 IAC 21.

One archaeological site, 12Sj599, was newly recorded as a result of the investigation. This multicomponent site consisted of a low density unidentified prehistoric camp site and a scatter of mid-19th century artifacts. Due to a lack of a clear historic context and limited information potential, the site is ineligible for the NRHP. Therefore, no additional investigation is recommended before the parcel is transferred out of state ownership.



CONCLUSION AND RECOMMENDATIONS

INDOT proposes the sale of excess parcel 5272-223, acquired in association with US 31 improvements (Des. No. 9904300 and 9904310). INDOT has determined that this surplus land will not be needed for right-of-way or other transportation purposes within a reasonable time in the future.

A Phase Ia field reconnaissance survey of the parcel was conducted in November of 2017 and September of 2019. The survey was conducted in order to identify any archaeological resources present within the project area and to assess their significance in terms of meeting the criteria for listing in the NRHP. The Phase Ia field investigations were performed in accordance with the 2019 "Guidebook for Indiana Historic Sites and Structures Inventory – Archaeological Sites" issued by the Division of Historic Preservation and Archaeology and with INDOT's

Cultural Resources Manual. All aspects of the Phase Ia investigations and the subsequent report preparation were conducted by a qualified professional archaeologist meeting the standards set forth by the U.S. Department of the Interior outlined in 36 CFR Part 61 and 66, and the Secretary of the Interior's "Guidelines for Historic Preservation and Archaeology" (48 FR 44716) and 312 IAC 21.

One archaeological site, 12Sj599, was newly recorded as a result of the investigations. This site consisted of an ephemeral unidentified prehistoric camp site and a 19th century historical scatter that has been disturbed by tree clearing for a utility corridor. Due to a lack of a clear historic context and limited information potential, the site is ineligible for the NRHP. Therefore, no additional investigation is recommended prior to transfer out of state ownership.

NARRATIVE

This Red Flag Investigation is being performed for the sale of two (2) excess parcels, LA 5272 Parcels 223 and 229, which are 5.632 acres and 0.827 acre, respectively. Parcel 223, divided into two (2) portions by US 31, includes one (1) portion located in the southwest quadrant of the US 31 and Kern Road intersection, and another portion located approximately 0.25 mile south-southwest of the US 31 and Kern Road intersection. Parcel 229, also divided into two (2) portions by US 31, includes one (1) portion located in the southwest quadrant of the US 31 and Kern Road intersection and another portion located approximately 0.11 mile south of the US 31 and Kern Road intersection. Both subject parcels are located within St. Joseph County, Indiana. The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) has decided that this surplus land will not be needed for right-of-way or other transportation purposes in the foreseeable future. Explanation:

Underground Storage Tank (UST) Sites: Two (2) UST sites are located within the 0.5 mile search radius. The nearest UST site, associated with Osborn's Mini Mart-Phillips 66 (the former One Stop 78), 61045 US 31 South (Agency ID No. 35670), is located approximately 0.15 mile east of Parcel 229. According to the Indiana Department of Environmental Management (IDEM) Virtual File Cabinet (VFC), IDEM conducted an UST Inspection on August 23, 2017, and the facility was found to be out of compliance with equipment, operating, and maintenance requirements set forth in Indiana's UST Rule 329 IAC 9; however, documentation reviewed does not indicate that a release occurred. No impact is expected.

Leaking Underground Storage Tank (LUST) Sites: Six (6) LUST sites are located within the 0.5 mile search radius. The nearest LUST site, associated with McClure Oil (the former Country Convenience), 6220 US 31 South (Agency ID No. 32813), is located approximately 0.23 mile east-northeast of Parcel 229. According to the IDEM VFC, contamination still remains on site; however, groundwater flow appears to be to the northeast, away from the subject parcels. No impact is expected.

Brownfields: One (1) Brownfield site is located within the 0.5 mile search radius, approximately 0.45 mile northeast of Parcel 229. No impact is expected.

ECOLOGICAL INFORMATION SUMMARY

The St. Joseph County listing of the Indiana Natural Heritage Data Center information on endangered, threatened, or rare (ETR) species and high quality natural communities is attached with ETR species highlighted. A review of the Indiana Natural Heritage Database did not indicate the presence of ETR species within the 0.5 mile search radius. No impact is expected.

Red Flag Investigation - Water Resources LA 5272 Parcels 223 and 229 US 31, Excess Parcels St. Joseph County, Indiana






